#### UNESCO GLOBAL MIL WEEK 2025 announced - Register now!

UNESCO and the Government of Colombia announced that Global Media and Information Literacy (MIL) Week Feature Conference 2025 will be held in the historic city of Cartagena de Indias, Colombia, on 23–24 October 2025. This year's theme, "Minds over AI – MIL in Digital Spaces," will explore the critical role of media and information literacy in today's rapidly evolving digital landscape. As Artificial Intelligence continues to reshape how we access, share, consume and interpret information, MIL is more essential than ever in promoting critical thinking, civic engagement, and digital inclusion. UNESCO's MIL Conference will bring together governments, educators, civil society, media organizations, tech companies, creative industry and youth leaders to collaboratively shape a human-centered digital future. ### Launch of new UNESCO MIL Alliance Membership Database

## Psaroloco Educational Classroom SCHOOL BULLYING - DIVERSITY

Understanding diversity and inclusion is crucial for young students. Paul Mas' short film "Précieux" (Precious) explores these themes through Julie, a girl struggling to fit in until Emile, an autistic student, joins her class. This prompt reflects friendship, bullying, and inclusion. Through discussion and the U(nie)NO empathy exercise, students who experience exclusion due to unspoken social rules, analyze the film with the 5Ws of MIL methodology and engage in this activity helps children understand autism, self-determination, and the importance of solidarity.

Also, understanding bullying and differences are essential for young students. Elizabeth Ito's animated short movie "Welcome to My Life" introduces T-Kesh, a kind and thoughtful "monster" navigating life in a typical high school. His struggle to be accepted opens a window into how prejudice and stereotypes shape students' experiences. Through guided discussion and reflective activities, children explore themes of identity, bias, and belonging. The film's "mockumentary" style encourages empathy and challenges assumptions, helping students recognize exclusion, question bullying behaviors, and embrace inclusion with greater awareness.



"OYourself: Question what you get on media QYourself - Media Education to Combat Disinformation" is a multilateral Erasmus+ project on Media and Information Literacy (MIL), aimed at empowering educators across diverse settings with practical journalistic tools to combat misinformation. Developed collaboratively by trainers, researchers, and factcheckers, the educational materials enable teachers to integrate simple and effective journalistic techniques into their daily instruction. The project's innovation lies in its application across diverse target groups, including migrants, youth (18-35), high school students, and seniors. The partnership involves six organizations from five countries, coordinated by the University of the Basque Country (ES). Educational resources initially developed by the University have been adapted by each partner and are freely accessible via the project website. All methodology and research conducted within the project are documented in a final manual. This resource supports educators in fostering critical media reflection in the classroom, equipping learners to interpret and use information more responsibly and thoughtfully. 
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### **News from Greece**

### Athens nominated pilot UNESCO MIL City

On June 11, the City of Athens proudly participated in the UNESCO Media and Information Literacy (MIL) Cities Launch Event, held online by UNESCO with the participation of 50 global city leaders and stakeholders. Representing the capital of Greece, Mayor Harris Doukas presented Athens' candidacy to join the UNESCO MIL Cities, an initiative coordinated by EKKOMED.

In his remarks, Mayor Doukas emphasized Athens' dual identity as both a historic symbol of democracy and a modern, inclusive European capital. "In today's world of rapid digital change, critical thinking and informed public dialogue are more important than ever," he noted. "Athens is committed to equipping all citizens—especially youth and vulnerable groups—with the skills and spaces to navigate today's media landscape safely and responsibly."

The City of Athens has designated the Hellenic Film and Audiovisual Center – EKKOMED as its official focal point for the initiative. The organization will coordinate local efforts through an awareness campaign that will engage communities, and design impactful programs aligned with UNESCO's goals.

The 1st International Symposium of the International Centre of Films for Children and Young People (CIFEJ) was successfully held on Monday, May 5, 2025, in a large auditorium at the European Parliament Office in Athens. The event was coorganized by CIFEJ and the Hellenic Film and Audiovisual Center. Under the title "Storytelling through Kids & Media: Audience development across regional, national and cultural borders for future generations", the event marked the official launch of CIFEJ's new headquarters in Athens, after 14 years of presence in Tehran, and initiated a new chapter of international cooperation in the field of children's and youth audiovisual content.
